AGENDA: Moved by Abernathy and seconded by Tveit to approve the agenda. All voted aye. Motion passed.

MINUTES: Moved by Tveit and seconded by Abernathy to approve the minutes of the October 2, 2017 Commission meeting. All voted aye. Motion passed.

5:35 PUBLIC HEARING: REZONE AND PLAT LOTS 1A, 1B, 1C and 2R of LIGHTHOUSE ADDITION NW SEC 4 112-80: Time set for a public hearing to consider a request from Bruce and Linda Peterson to rezone Lighthouse Addition Lots 1 and 2 from Local business to Multi- Family and replat to Lots 1A, 1B, 1C and 2R Lighthouse Addition NW Sec 4 112-80. There was no public testimony. Moved by Tveit and seconded by Abernathy to approve Ordinance 2017-05 to rezone to Mulit-Family and the replat of Lots 1A, 1B, 1C & 2R Lighthouse Addition in NW Sec 4 112-80 contingent on the building being moved off the property line. All voted aye. Motion passed.

5:40 PUBLIC HEARING: TO CONSIDER CHANGES TO ARTICLE 2-117 WIND ENERGY

CONVERSION SYSTEMS: Time set for a public hearing to consider an ordinance amending Sections 2-117 and 4-205 and 4-206 of Ordinance 1997-03 relating to Wind Energy setbacks, decommissioning plans, and financial assistance. Approximately 45 people attended the public hearing. Those speaking in support of the change were: Jan Krull, Lowell Smith, Tonja Jessen, Ryan Webb, Mark Klebsch and Christina White, a representative of Infinity Renewables. Those speaking in opposition, asking the setback to be greater than those proposed were: Angie Bollweg, Brittany Kerr from the SD Aviation Association, Karla O@Day, Michael Bollweg, and, Reece Almond, attorney from Davenport Law Office in Sioux Falls representing Don & Judy Bollweg, and Michael Bollweg.

Those speaking in support of the proposed ordinance in general indicated that the ordinance as presented protects their right to choose to host a wind tower while still protecting the rights of those who choose not to participate. Opponents, in general, indicated concerns for various health issues, quality of life, and safety for nearby residents and aerial applicators. The opponents recommended greater setbacks from residences, property lines, roads and right of ways as well as decreased limits for noise.

Commissioner Tveit said he considered increasing the setback, but upon hearing no substantial evidence, concluded not to infringe upon the rights of property owners. Commissioner Tveit moved and Abernathy seconded to approve Ordinance 2017-06 amending Sections 2-117 and 4-205 and 4-206 of Ordinance 1997-03, and adding to Section 2-117- F-14d that upon decommission of the turbine all easements to be released. All voted aye. Motion passed.

AUDIT REPORT: Terry Zell, Auditor with Department of Legislative Audit reviewed audit findings for the 2015 and 2016 financial reports.
