FIRST READING: REZONE AND PLAT SPAID TRACT 1 IN E1/2 SE SEC 5 112-77: Neil and Andrea Spaid are requesting to create a residential parcel for their son and daughter-in-law for a residential home. The E1/2 SE Sec 5-112-77 will be rezoned to PUD with Ag A rules and plat Spaid Tract 1, a 40 acre parcel for a single residential home. Moved by Rounds and seconded by Abernathy to set a public hearing for November 15, 2021 at 5:35 pm. All voted Aye. Motion passed.

FIRST READING: AMENDEMENT TO THE PUD FOR ROYAL RIDGE ESTATES IN NW SEC 8 ANS SW SEC 9 110-78. Matthew & Amanda Falk are requesting to amend the existing PUD document for Royal Ridge Estates to allow an existing home to be placed on Lot 3.
